violations. The Cost Sheet in the amount of \$41.04 was tendered into evidence and accepted by Special Magistrate Fuller with no objections.

Special Magistrate Fuller granted the recommendations as presented. The property owner has until September 3, 2017 to bring the property into compliance and shall notify the code officer for re-inspection. The costs to date of \$41.04 will be ordered, as well.

Ms. Joseph recommended the property owners be found in violation of the above referenced code with the violations to be corrected on or before September 3, 2017 by mowing the entire property and trimming all high weeds, as well as removing all garbage, trash, junk and debris. In the event the property is not brought into compliance on or before the compliance date, and/or not maintained in a state of compliance, a daily fine of \$250 per day will be assessed for each day the property is in violation beyond the compliance date. The City of Port Orange shall have the option to abate the violation as this is a health and safety concern. The accused is further ordered to contact the Code Enforcement Officer to arrange for a re-inspection of the property to verify compliance with the Order. Any future violations under this ordinance shall be considered repeat violations. The Cost Sheet in the amount of \$69.12 was tendered into evidence and accepted by Special Magistrate Fuller with no objections.

Special Magistrate Fuller granted the recommendations as presented. The property owner has until September 3, 2017 to bring the property into compliance and shall notify the code officer for re-inspection. The costs to date of \$69.12 will be ordered, as well.

An inspection of the premises on July 21, 2016, indicates that certain violation(s) of the City of Port Orange Code exists.

Briefly stated, the property is in violation of the following:

The owner of an improved lot in a residential zone with lot sizes of one acre or less shall keep such lot free and clear of all fallen trees and limbs. All weeds, grass and undergrowth shall be cut to a height not exceeding ten inches.
 - The initial inspection of this property found high weeds and grass and undergrowth. Property is to be mowed and all high weeds and undergrowth cut back.
2. City of Port Orange Code of Ordinances, Chapter 42, Section 42-26 Cleanliness of property generally-Duty of owner (f) Garbage, waste, trash, etc., prohibited. The owner of every lot, piece and parcel of land located within the city shall keep each such lot, piece and parcel of land free and clear of garbage, waste, trash, debris and junk.
 - The initial inspection of this property found trash, debris, and junk that needs to be disposed of.
3. City of Port Orange Code of Ordinance, Chapter 42, Section 42-32 – Storage of vehicles, furniture, etc. No owner of property within the city shall permit the storage of vehicles or parts of vehicles, furniture, appliances or other personal property upon the premises, except in an enclosed building.
 - All outside stored items must be properly stored in an enclosed building including semi tractor cab.

Failure to comply after this date may result in the commencement of appropriate code enforcement action and/or possible fine of up to \$1,000.00 per day for a first violation, \$5,000.00 per day per violation for a repeat violation, and up to \$15,000.00 per violation if the code enforcement board or special magistrate finds the violation to be irreparable or irreversible in nature.

If the violation is corrected and then recurs, or if the violation is not corrected by the specified time for correction by the Code Compliance Inspector, the case shall be presented to the **Special Magistrate** on the date set forth below, even if the violation has been corrected prior to this scheduled hearing.

The burden shall rest upon the Respondent to request a re-inspection by the Code Compliance Inspector to determine whether the property is in compliance.

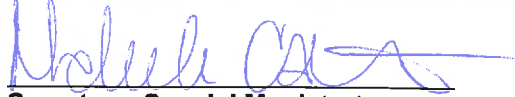

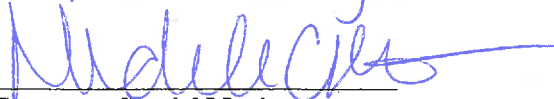

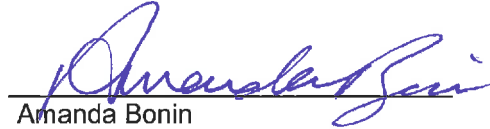

This home is abandoned and from what neighbors have stated kids are coming into the home and that the floors have holes and is missing in some areas. This was also witnessed during the last Code Enforcement Case that was not corrected. To correct the violations, the entire property needs to be mowed, all high weeds and grass trimmed, and all garbage needs to be removed from the property, and all doors and windows must be repaired, operable, and secured. If the floors have not been repaired from the last Code Enforcement case, they too will need to be repaired. FINDING OF FACT, CONCLUSION OF LAW AND ORDER
(THIS DOES NOT CONSTITUTE A LIEN)

THIS CAUSE came on for public hearing before the Code Enforcement Special Magistrate on August 9, 2017, after due notice to the Respondent(s), and the Special Magistrate having heard testimony under oath, received evidence and heard argument from Staff thereupon issues its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order, as follows:

B. Replace all plants, trees, and shrubs which have died, are dying, or are missing; remove outside storage, including the displays in front of the store which are not permitted per the development requirements; re-stripe all parking lot markings; remove all trash and debris; pressure wash the building and paint it if necessary after pressure washing; apply mulch to all landscape beds and hedgerows; repair the damage to the back corner of the building where the wood and exterior materials are damaged/falling off; repair the dumpster enclosure; remove the carts and cardboard in the back of the building; and ensure all irrigation is in proper working order. This condition was first observed at the real property described above on May 8, 2017; re-inspections were made on July 21, 2017 and confirmed the condition as being in non-compliance although some violations were corrected after the compliance date. - 1) 2015 Florida Building Code, Section 105 (Permits), Section 105.1 (Required) as adopted per Chapter 14, Article II of the City of Port Orange Code of Ordinances: Failure to Obtain a Building Permit: Any owner or authorized agent who intends to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish, or change the occupancy of a building or structure, or to erect, install, enlarge, alter, repair, remove, convert or replace any required impact-resistant coverings, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system, the installation of which is regulated by this code, or to cause any such work to be done, shall first make application to the building official and obtain the required permit.
 - The initial inspection found a re-built deck with new railings. A re-inspection shows the condition to be the same and no permits applied for.
