SUBJECT: (4) Discussion on Tentative City Millage and Tentative City Budget for FY 2023

DEPARTMENT: Finance

GOAL: Goal 5 - Fiscal Sustainability

RECOMMENDED MOTION: None needed

SUMMARY: The public hearing is convened to discuss the millage rate and budget. The City of Port Orange City Council shall discuss the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Budget which commences on October 1, 2022 and continues through September 30, 2023.

The first item for consideration is the tentative millage necessary to fund the FY2023 tentative budget for the City of Port Orange.

- The City of Port Orange is the taxing authority.
- Current year taxable value for operating purposes is \$4,513,302,821.
- \$4.4557 is the rolled-back rate per \$1,000 of valuation
- \$4.8610 is the staff recommended millage rate.
- Staff recommended millage represents a 9.10% increase over the rolled-back rate.

This increase covers the increased cost of operations and maintenance of the General Fund and the requested Capital Outlay and Capital Improvement Projects.

The second item for consideration is the FY2023 tentative budget for the City of Port Orange.

- This budget includes all operation and capital costs for FY 2023.
- The City of Port Orange is the taxing authority.
- The FY2023 budget includes the General, Special Revenue, Debt Service, Capital, Enterprise and Internal Service Funds.
- Per the City Charter, the City Manager must submit an annual budget. We have provided an annual budget at the Fund Level.

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- The City-Wide Fiscal Year 2023 budget for all funds is \$161,305,469.

In addition to the foregoing tentative millage/budget levy, there will be a voter approved millage levy of 0.2100 mills to fund the debt service for the 2016 general obligation refunding bonds issued for public safety capital facilities as approved by referendum in 2006.

A Public Hearing will be held on September 21, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers at City Hall, 1000 City Center Circle, Port Orange, Florida, to discuss and adopt a final millage rate and the final budget for FY2023 for the City of Port Orange.

**Public Hearing for Adoption of Tentative Millage/Budget
September 7, 2022**

Agenda Item 4.

Announce the following:

"The public hearing is now convened to discuss the millage rate and budget. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Budget commences on October 1, 2022 and continues through September 30, 2023. We will begin with the City of Port Orange City Council discussion of the tentative millage necessary to fund the FY2023 tentative budget for the City of Port Orange. The City of Port Orange is the taxing authority and the current year taxable value for operating purposes is \$4,513,302,821. The rolled-back millage rate is \$4.4557 mills per \$1,000 of valuation. The staff recommended millage rate is \$4.8610 mills per \$1,000 of valuation which represents a 9.10% increase in ad valorem tax revenues above the rolled-back rate."

Ask the City Manager to comment on the increase in millage over the rolled-back rate and the specific purposes for the increase.

Ask for Council discussion, regarding the reasons for the increase in the final millage above the rolled back rate.

Announce the following:

"The Council will now hear comments regarding the proposed tentative millage. The general public shall be allowed to address the council, to make comments and to ask questions."

Ask for public comments.

Announce that Council will now review the tentative budget and discuss revisions, if any.

Announce the following:

"This budget includes all operating and capital costs for FY 2023. This budget includes the General, Special Revenue, Debt Service, Capital, Enterprise and Internal Service Funds. The proposed City-wide FY 2023 budgets for all funds is \$161,305,469.

Ask Council for any comments or revisions.

If no revisions, then go to Agenda Item 5.

If revisions are made, changing the tentative millage/budget from that presented in agenda package, then agree to revise the tentative millage/budget. (**do not** vote to adopt and no formal motion - just consensus of Council to direct the manager to recompute the tentative millage and mark up the Resolution adopting the tentative millage rate, accordingly.)

SUBJECT: (5) Resolution No. 22-25 - Adopting the Tentative Millage Rate for FY 2022-2023

DEPARTMENT: Finance

GOAL: Goal 5 - Fiscal Sustainability

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move to approve Resolution No. 22-25.

SUMMARY: Per Florida Statute Section 200.065, the City Council shall adopt a tentative millage rate prior to the adoption of a tentative budget and shall otherwise comply with the controlling provisions of the law.

The Volusia County Property Appraiser has certified the gross taxable value of property for operating purposes within the City as \$4,513,302,821 and certified a rolled-back rate of \$4.4557 per \$1,000 of taxable value for the City of Port Orange. The City Council deems it necessary to levy and does hereby levy a tentative tax of \$4.8610 mills upon all real and personal property within the City for operational purposes. The operating levy of \$4.8610 per \$1,000 represents a 9.10% increase from the rolled-back rate of \$4.4557 per \$1,000 of taxable value. The tentative operating millage for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 would provide for a tentative budget of \$20,842,206 in ad valorem proceeds.

The required millage for the 2006 General Obligation voter approved debt service, which was refunded in 2016 is \$0.2100 mills. The required voter debt service would be budgeted at \$900,404.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-25

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA; ADOPTING THE TENTATIVE AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX MILLAGE RATES TO BE LEVIED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 (OCTOBER 1, 2022 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2023); PROVIDING FOR SCRIVENER'S ERRORS: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Port Orange, Florida, has determined the amount of revenue required to meet the City's operating and capital objectives for fiscal year 2023; and

WHEREAS, a substantial portion of this operating revenue is derived from ad valorem tax receipts; and

WHEREAS, the voters of the City of Port Orange approved the levy of additional millage necessary to fund debt service payments on bonds issued for public safety capital facilities; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the tentative millage rate has been conducted by City Council at 5:30 p.m. on September 7, 2022, and a final hearing will be conducted at 5:30 p.m. on September 21, 2022, in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, 1000 City Center Circle, Port Orange, Florida.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The tentative millage rate for fiscal year 2023 for the City of Port Orange is hereby levied at 4.8610 mills per \$1,000.00 of valuation. This tentative millage

rate is a 9.10% increase above the rolled-back rate, which is the percentage increase in property taxes adopted by the City Council for general government operating and capital purposes.

Section 2. The tentative millage rate of 0.2100 mills per \$1,000.00 of valuation is hereby adopted as a voter-approved levy of additional millage necessary to fund debt service payments on the 2006 general obligation bonds for public safety capital facilities which were refunded in 2016.

Section 3. Typographical errors and other matters of a similar nature that do not affect the intent of this Resolution, as determined by the City Clerk and City Attorney, may be corrected.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

SUMMARY: This is a request for the City Council to approve the tentative budget for Fiscal Year 2022 - 2023.

The City Council of the City of Port Orange has complied with all requirements and procedures of Florida law in processing this resolution. The City Council pursuant to the Charter of the City of Port Orange and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, does hereby adopt the tentative General Fund, Special Revenue Funds, Debt Service, Capital Improvement Funds (CIP), Enterprise Funds and other Internal Service Funds, in the amount of \$161,305,469 and are attached to the Resolution as Exhibit "A".

RESOLUTION NO. 22-26

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA; ADOPTING THE TENTATIVE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 (OCTOBER 1, 2022 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2023) FOR THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE; PROVIDING FOR APPROPRIATION AND PROCEDURES; PROVIDING FOR SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Manager of the City of Port Orange recommended a tentative annual budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2023; and has submitted same to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Charter, Section 3.08 of the City of Port Orange Code of Ordinances, states that the City Council shall by resolution adopt the annual budget, budget amendments and authorize appropriations; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes, Sections 166.241 and Section 200.065, commonly known as the Truth in Millage or TRIM Bill, requires that the City Council hold a public hearing to consider the adoption of the tentative millage rate and budget for the Fiscal Year 2023; and

WHEREAS, both the Eastport CRA and Town Center CRA approved their respective budgets during separate meetings on August 16, 2022, and submitted to the City of Port Orange for inclusion in the City's budget; and

WHEREAS, the City of Port Orange held a public hearing on the tentative budget has been conducted by the City Council at 5:30 p.m. on September 7, 2022, and a final hearing will be conducted at 5:30 p.m. on September 21, 2022, in City Council Chambers at City Hall, 1000 City Center Circle, Port Orange, Florida; and

WHEREAS, during the course of said public hearing, all persons desiring to voice objection or make comments upon the tentative budget for Fiscal Year 2023 were given an opportunity to do so.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY
OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. Approval of the Tentative Budget for Fiscal Year 2023. Pursuant to the City of Port Orange Charter and Florida Statutes, Chapters 166 and 200, the City of Port Orange hereby adopts the various tentative budgets as set forth in **Exhibit “A”**, attached hereto and incorporated herein as a part of this resolution with the same effect as if set forth in the body hereof.

Section 2. Final Budget Public Hearing. The final hearing on the budget will be conducted at 5:30 p.m. on September 21, 2022, in City Council Chambers at City Hall, 1000 City Center Circle, Port Orange, Florida, where interested parties may appear and address the City Council on budget-related matters.

Section 3. Supplemental amendments to appropriations may be affected as deemed necessary in strict compliance with the procedures specified in Chapter 2, Article VI, Division 3, Code of Ordinances, City of Port Orange, Florida.

Section 4. Typographical errors and other matters of a similar nature that do not affect the intent of this Resolution, as determined by the City Clerk and City Attorney, may be corrected.

Section 5. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
